

# 3rd annual BESSEMER GEOCACHE DASH

## Official rules and cache list

TO PLAY THE BESSEMER GEOCACHE DASH:

- \* Enter the co-ordinates for the geocaches listed on the back of this sheet into a GPS tracking unit.
- \* Find the container (geocache) hidden at or near the co-ordinates given.
- \* Please try not to give away the hiding place to others or damage the hide spot.
- \* Take only ONE entry card from each geocache per player.
- \* REHIDE the container just as you found it – for the next player.
- \* Do not move the container.
- \* Fill out contact information on the back of each entry card and return them to the drawing box at:

by 2:00 PM CDT on Jul 4, 2011**

- **Drawing for prizes donated by local businesses will be held on Massie field after the parade and before the music and fireworks. You do not need to be present to win.**
- **Only one prize awarded per player. Finding all the caches increases your odds of winning.**

**ONLY ONE** entry card per player per cache is allowed.  
Entry card **MUST** be filled out by person entering the drawing.

**#1 Behind City Hall N46\* 28.630' W090\* 03.071'**

More evidence of railroading days along what will be a new multi-city hiking trail, coming soon

**#2 Bessemer Welcome N46\* 28.857' W090\* 04.357'**

Welcome to ALL. I Love how this sign changes with the seasons, now its happy JULY 4!

**#3 Hidden Keystone Bridge N46\* 28.429' W090\* 04.311'**

...similar to the one in Ramsey. Cache is NOT down the hill, but the view of the bridge is.

**#4 Bessemer's Sand Box N46\* 28.643' W090\* 03.602'**

It takes a LOT of sand to keep our winter roads safe!!

**#5 Great Conglomerate Falls N46\* 37.919' W090\* 03.534'**

An easy .3 mi hike will get you to the cache, but not to the falls. Worth a look! The stairs await!

**#6 Black River – north Bessemer N46\* 30.720' W090\* 03.184'**

Yet another view of the mighty Black River. Got tackle?

**#7 Kalandar Creek N46\* 29.065' W090\* 02.891'**

This little creek starts near town and sneaks its way north to the Black River.

**#8 Rainbow Falls N46\* 39.546' W090\* 02.611'**

CHALLENGE. Better view from the other side. Good hike. See the challenges of trail maint.

**#9 Scenic Overlook N46\* 40.060' W090\* 02.765'**

A very nice view of Lake Superior, Black River Harbor break water, and sandy beach.

**#10 Black River Lodge N46\* 32.676' W090\* 04.962'**

This place has a lot to offer. Owner is VERY friendly and is glad to have you stopping by.

**#11 In the Pines N46\* 29.185' W090\* 03.287'**

Another view of Bessemers wonderful Bluff Valley Park – featured in this event EVERY year.

**#12 Powdermill Creek – Yale Loc. N46\* 27.794' W090\* 04.500'**

A babbling brook, Ore piles from the old Peterson Mine nearby.

**#13 Sharon Lutheran Church N46\* 28.719' W090\* 03.119'**

An easy grab cache right down town at a wonderful old church.
